CHAPTER ONE

"To the praise of the glory of His grace, wherein He hath made us accepted in the Beloved" [Eph. 1:6 (KJV)].

This epistle, written and delivered about the same time as Philippians, Colossians and Philemon, was written by the apostle Paul while he was a prisoner in Rome about AD 60-62. Although it bears the name of the church in Ephesus, it was intended to be circulated among all the churches in Asia. Unlike many of Paul's letters, Ephesians does not deal with specific problems within a local church or with an individual. Instead it addresses the common needs of all believers and the truths most essential for today's church, also known as the Body of Christ.

Through this Bible study you will gain a greater understanding of the revelation God gave to Paul concerning the "dispensation of the grace of God" and the "mystery of Christ." When you are done you should have a better appreciation of your position in Christ and how to live a more Christ-like life.

In preparation for this series of lessons, please prayerfully read through the entire Book of Ephesians. Do not begin the question and answer section until you can answer YES to the following question:

CHAPTER TWO

"For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that, not of yourselves, it is the gift of God -- not of works, lest any man should boast" [Eph 2:8 (KJV)].

This is one of the most important chapters of the Bible. It focuses upon the Christian believer's life, past, present, and future. It shows what your condition was before you accepted Christ and what your life has become as a result of Christ's work. This chapter also emphasizes the importance of salvation by grace through faith, plus nothing, and establishes the foundation upon which the church, the Body of Christ, is built.

Take time to read through this chapter and pray that God would open your eyes to the truths contained therein.
